Congratulations on your interest in our trip to China in October, 2010. Our earlier business trip to China in November, 2009 consisted of 12,000 business people with their families and friends. You will visit memorable sites, both ancient and modern, and enjoy a multitude of unforgettable experiences.

Of professional interest, you will also learn a great deal about how the Chinese business system operates. As you consider whether to travel along with other business people or just as a tourist, please do not hesitate to ask questions. We recommend that you do some "homework" to help with your decision. Read a few travel guides. Do some research on the Internet. We are convinced that this will be one of the most unique trips you will have the opportunity to make.

Please do not wait too long to decide whether to accompany us...space is limited.

We feel that this tour is an exceptional value. The cost is \$1,899 per person based on double occupancy for Chambers, and \$1,999 for non-chamber members. The cost includes round trip airfare, 4 and 5 star hotel accommodations, deluxe tour bus, a knowledgeable English-speaking tour guide in each city, three full meals everyday, fees for all tour attractions on the itinerary, airport taxes and fuel surcharges. A single room for the entire trip will cost an additional \$450 and an upgrade to business class on the international round trip flight is \$5,000, not including Chinese domestic flights.

A refundable registration fee of \$200 per person is required and due at the time you register and no later than August 1, 2010. This will be deducted from your total tour fare, the balance of which will be due before September 1. After September 1 we do not take any new bookings. No changes to the booking are allowed. Cancellation fee is \$500.

Securing or updating a passport is your responsibility, and you may also take care of the required visa yourself. However, if you wish us to handle the visa application, you will need to provide us with your passport, a signed visa application form, two passport photos and \$145 before August 1. We will return your passport to you in a timely manner. Should you need assistance completing the visa application, please ask us. An invaluable pre-tour briefing for all participants will be held (date to be determined) at which time we will answer all of your questions and familiarize you with details you will need to know.

We have 29 years of experience in the China tour business and feel confident that we can respond to your inquiries to your satisfaction. Whether you have questions on tipping or taxis, luggage or lunches, customs or rest rooms, we will prepare you well for your adventure.

China is a modern country, so you need not feel as though you are preparing to travel back in time, to a less sophisticated society. In many instances, the country is not "behind" so much as "different." For example, you will find very few ATM machines, but travelers checks and credit cards are accepted everywhere. Leave your checkbooks and check cards behind. The electricity in China is 220 volts and an adapter is required to operate even an American hair dryer. However, both the adapter and the hair dryer are available at the hotels in which we will be staying. Though you will be treated to sumptuous regional foods, you may forgo the chopsticks and grab a Big Mac or a plate of KFC wings. To the dismay of some traditionalists, you may also partake of a genuine Starbucks. We hope you will join us!



DAY 1 OCTOBER 2: PALM SPRINGS/BEIJING

Board a convenient charter bus in the morning, and travel to LAX for an afternoon Flight Mu586 by 12:30PM to Beijing. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide cabin jetliner. Cross the International Dateline.

DAY 2 OCTOBER 3: BEIJING

(King Wing Hotel/5-Star, 17 Dongsanhuan Rd. S., Tel: 86-10-67668866) Arrive in Beijing, the Capital of China at 11:00PM after a stopover in Shanghai. You will be met by your local tour guide at the airport. Transfer to the hotel.

DAY 3 OCTOBER 4: BEIJING

Visit Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world, and the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 AD, where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest. Sightseeing also includes the Palace Museum, also known as the Forbidden City, home of 24 emperors with a total space of 9,999 rooms, and the Summer Palace, known for it's significance such as the Long Corridor with painted gallery, Kunming Lake and Longevity Hill, Seventeen-Arch Bridge and Marble Boat.

DAY 4 OCTOBER 5: BEIJING

Tour bus excursion to the Great Wall, the 4,000-mile long and 2,000 years old construction is said to be the only man-made structure visible by the naked eye from the moon. Visit to the Ming Tombs, one of 13 Ming Emperors' Tombs is fully excavated and open for exploration. Roasted Beijing Duck Dinner.



DAY 5 OCTOBER 6: BEIJING/SHANGHAI/SUZHOU

(Glamor Hotel/4-Star, 6 Tongjingbei Rd., Tel: 86-512-65338811) Morning China Eastern flight MU583 11:10AM/11:10PM to Shanghai, then take the tour bus trip to Suzhou. Afternoon sightseeing to the centuries old Lingering Garden, Tiger Hill and Hanshan Temple. Visit to the National

Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, an important local craft with 1,000 years history. Evening Dinner Show of traditional Chinese Music.

DAY 6 OCTOBER 7: SUZHOU/HANGZHOU

(Regal Hotel/5-Star, 370 Gym Rd., Tel: 86-571-56199999) Morning tour bus journey to Hangzhou. Visit to Economic Development Zone. Visit to the centuries old Lingyin Temple, with the main feature of the 64.3 ft-high camphor-wood carved Buddha.

DAY 7 OCTOBER 8: HANGZHOU/SHANGHAI

(Guangdong Hotel/4-Star, 328 Yixian Rd., Shanghai, Tel: 86-21-51171888) Morning boat cruise on West Lake with relaxing stopover at jewel-like pagodas and tea houses. Afternoon tour bus trip to Shanghai.



DAY 8 OCTOBER 9: SHANGHAI

Sightseeing includes the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rock works and over arching trees. Visit to the Bund, a famous waterfront park. Business visit to the Pudong economic development zone.

DAY 9 OCTOBER 10: SHANGHAI/LOS ANGELES/PALM SPRINGS

You may spend your final hours in China on your own in the morning. Afternoon flight MU583 will depart by 2:50PM for Los Angeles where you will arrive at 10:30AM on the same day and return to your Chamber parking via bus.



OPTIONAL TRIP TO XI'AN

We design this optional trip to Xi'an mainly for those who travel to China for the second time, as they have already visited Suzhou and Hangzhou during their first visit to China.

DAY 1 - DAY 4, The same itinerary like everybody else.

DAY 5 OCTOBER 6:

Morning flight to Xi'an, stay at Grand Castle Hotel. Afternoon sightseeing to the Big Wild Geese Pagoda. Evening entertainment of Tang Style Dancing.

DAY 6 OCTOBER 7:

Morning bus excurses to the Terracotta Warriors at the Tomb of the First Emperor of Qin Dynasty. On the way back, visit the Huaqing Hot Spring Park and Banpo Museum, a preserved pre-historic cavemen site.

DAY 7 - DAY 9, Flight to Shanghai, then the same itinerary like everybody else.

Additional Price: The additional cost is \$450USD/per person, on the basis tour fare of per person to the regular itinerary. The single room supplement is the same as the regular trip.
